## Recent Highlights

- CRA received a new NSF award, [Center for Evaluating the Research Pipeline: A Community Resource](#), to fund CERP projects through a cooperative agreement with NSF.
- A total of 149 institutions worked with CERP for the [Data Buddies Survey 2023](#) (DBS), with 46 departments receiving “elite” status by obtaining a response rate of 20 percent or more.
- [CISE REU Evaluation](#) contract with NSF was completed. CERP will continue providing services to the REU PIs through the new cooperative agreement.
- [BPCnet.org](#) is undergoing a redesign based on user feedback and to accommodate the expanding content.
- [BPCnet BPC Indicators Report 2024](#) was published as a pilot report. This report will be published annually to provide an overview of data on some of the major indicators of broadening participation in computing.

## What's Coming Up

- [Departmental BPC Plan Workshop 2024](#) will be virtual and include synchronous and asynchronous components. The workshop will begin with an orientation session on July 29 followed by a meeting day on August 16.
- The new CERP Advisory Board will begin meeting later this year. Two additional Board members will join by the first meeting.
- “DBS-on-demand” short survey modules with accompanying real-time reporting will be launched as part of the NSF BPC Alliance Data Alliance on Persistence and Perception in Computing (DAPPIC). DAPPIC is a partnership between CERP and Northeastern University’s Center for Inclusive Computing.
- BPCnet.org redesign web development will be completed by summer 2024. Launch date of the new site will be advertised through an outreach campaign.
- Evaluation of programs and events from CRA Committees and external partners will continue.
- CERP will be hosting BPC Community Forums and attending BPC Accelerator meetings.



## Computing Research Association - Education (CRA-E)

### Recent Highlights:

- [CSGrad4US Fellowship & Mentoring Program](#) – 68 fellows currently enrolled in CISE PhD programs. 71 of 74 pre-fellows applied to Ph.D. programs, 47 admitted and will start in Fall 2024, nine admitted and deferred (will start in Fall 2025), eight applied and were not admitted, five applied and were accepted but declined, two are still listed as decision pending. We established the review process for the next cohort within Monday.com, using Jotforms for reviews. We have recruited three panels of reviewers, each reviewing approximately 12 applications and participating in panels. For 2024, we received 99 completed applications, of which 84 met the eligibility criteria.
- [UR2PhD – Undergraduate Research to PhD National Mentoring](#) – We hired instructors and recruited faculty, undergrads, and grad student mentors for two offerings of the undergraduate research methods course and grad student mentoring training course this summer to accommodate semester and trimester schedules. Our bridge webinar series was launched with four virtual sessions, one each month February through May. Session attendance varied from 26 to 71 participants. We held a virtual advisory board meeting on March 7. We are actively working on identifying subaward partners and recruiting IPs for fall 2024. We are interviewing facilitators for the first fall grad admissions preparation workshop series. We are revising program components based on feedback received to help reach students who would not otherwise participate in research.
- [CRA Outstanding Undergraduate Research Awards](#) – The 2023/24 competition received 153 nominations. In addition to the four winners and four runners-up, 16 nominees were selected as finalists, and 116 received honorable mentions. We are currently forming the committee for handling nominations next year.
- [CRA-E Faculty Mentoring Award](#) – The committee reviewed nine nominees and selected three awardees this year. The awardees are Dr. Carrie Demmans Epp (Univ. of Alberta), Dr. Raja Kushalnagar (Gallaudet Univ.), and Dr. Mubarak Shah, (Univ. of Central Florida).
- [Undergraduate Research Highlights](#) – The research highlights series showcases outstanding research conducted by undergraduate students, one highlight approximately every month (10 per year) written by CRA-E Graduate Fellows.
- [SIGCSE Workshop on Professional Development for Teaching Faculty](#) – The seventh instance was held in March 2024 at the SIGCSE Conference in Portland, OR. Our two-year NSF proposal was awarded (~\$50K) for this workshop and a virtual landscape series.

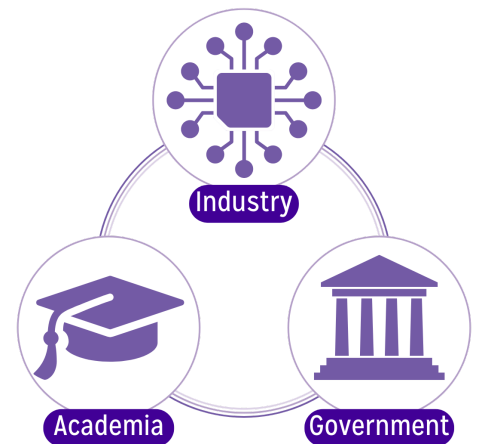

- Secured an NSF subaward to disseminate the CRA Practitioner to Professor (P2P) Survey, resulting in over 2,000 responses.
- Facilitated the Dual Appointment Working Group in disseminating a survey to the community, garnering over 130 responses.
- Orchestrated the GenAI for Research and Science Roundtable in May.
- Co-organized the CCC Virtual Roundtable on LLMs and the Future of Programming.
- Organized two sessions at the CRA Conference at Snowbird focused on GenAI in Scientific Research and Dual Appointments: Living Between Academia and Industry.

- Planning a workshop on Sharing Healthcare Data on October 17-18, 2024 in Washington, DC.
- Planning a workshop on Breadth of Partnership Practices in Fostering Academia/Industry Relationships in Spring 2025.

## Recent Highlights

- 252 participants and 42 panelists attended the co-located 2024 Grad Cohort for IDEALS and Grad Cohort for Women.
- 36 participants and 21 mentors are participating in the 2024 DREU program this summer.
- 16 participants were accepted to the summer 2024 DREAM program.
- Sophia Shao, Assistant Professor of Electrical Engineering and Computer Sciences at the University of California, Berkeley, received the 2024 Anita Borg Early Career Award.
- Martez Mott, Senior Researcher in the Ability group and Human Centered AI Experiences team at Microsoft Research, received the 2024 Skip Ellis Early Career Award.
- Recent Pipelines articles include a roadmap of CISE BPC efforts through the years and an overview of the new DREAM program.
- CRA-WP conducted outreach at SIGCSE to share information and resources about computing research careers and program opportunities.
- The CRA-WP resume database and graduating class directory were updated and shared with sponsors.
- CRA-WP ran its first series of Mentoring Mentors webinars in May 2024, content from the series will be made available to members soon.

## What's Coming

- CRA-WP will present a session at the Tapia conference in September 2024 on Effective Programs for Increasing Diversity in Computing: Learning and Engaging.
- CRA-WP will run a six-week Career Mentoring Webinar Series from October to November 2024, open to computing researchers in industry, government labs, and academia who have previously attended a CRA-WP CMW.
- CRA-WP will continue to collaborate with CRA-E on NSF CSGrad4US and UR2PhD and will continue participating in the CRA program LEVEL UP, which is in collaboration with ACM and IEEE-CS.
- CRA-WP will host co-located Grad Cohort for Women and Grad Cohort for IDEALS again in 2025.

### Highlights

- **Thank you, Stephanie Forrest, for your service!** On July 1, Stephanie Forrest stepped down as the chair of the CRA Government Affairs Committee, a position she has held since 2017.
- **CRA Statement Expressing Serious Concerns About Fiscal Year 2024 Funding Levels:** In March, in response to the [poor FY24 final budgets](#) for NSF and other federal research agencies, [CRA released a statement](#) expressing serious concerns with the state of the US research enterprise. The statement highlighted the likely negative impacts these budget cuts will have on the country's research enterprise, with the reduced quantity of research, number of researchers, and number of students educated in key fundamental areas of computing and other fields of discovery.
- **Policy Spotlight CRN Feature:** In March, CRA launched a new Computing Research News feature called "[Policy Spotlight: Conversations with Computing Researchers](#)."
- **Senate Robotics Showcase & Demo Day:** CRA co-hosted, with Carnegie Mellon University and IEEE-USA, an [exhibition of 35 robotic demonstrations](#), representing the field across industry, academia, and government, in the US Senate on April 30. With over 250 attendees, the event was headlined by remarks from NSF Director Panchanathan and Representative Bill Foster (D-IL). CRA contributed three long-time CCC contributors as exhibitors: Chad Jenkins (University of Michigan), Melanie Moses (University of New Mexico), and Holly Yanco (University of Massachusetts Lowell).
- **CRA Welcomes Tisdale Fellow:** In early June, GAC welcomed **Radhika Agrawal** as this summer’s **Eban Tisdale Science Policy Fellow**. Radhika is a rising sophomore at Ohio Wesleyan University, studying quantitative economics and computer science. She spent the summer helping GAC staff navigate science policy issues through the end of July.

### What’s Coming

- **September Congressional Visit Day:** GAC will hold its regular Congressional Visit Day (CVD) in Washington DC on Tuesday, September 10 and Wednesday, September 11. For volunteers, CRA will schedule meetings with Congressional staff, provide materials and training on having an effective meeting, and host a thank you reception the night before the meetings. Participants will be responsible for their travel costs.
