


# Creepy vs. Cool



Sign in when Kinect sees you, before you pick up a controller or remote control—without even turning on a light or putting down your sandwich.



**How Kinect works** 








#### You are the controller

When Kinect is turned on, you can play using its video, infrared, and audio sensors, even when there's not much light in the room. Turn off Kinect in Settings > Kinect. Your sign-in data will never leave this Xbox. Apps and games you play can only access the Kinect data they need, and they need your permission for that data to leave the console. Change your sign-in settings in Settings > Sign-in, security & passkey.
